There are many great Android one phones out there, but if you ask us, Nokia 7.2 is the best you can get. The HMD Global-led Nokia brand has been kicking out many of the big smartphones over the past few years, and for the North American market, 7.2 stands as an incredibly strong offering. Nokia phones have a legacy to be well built, and that point keeps it true with 7.2 100%. It has a durable aluminum frame with a sleek glass back that looks and feels incredible. Around the front, the 6.3-inch screen is a joy to look at. Not only is it crisp with a resolution of 2220x1080, but its ability to natively play HDR10 content and convert SDR videos into HDR ones means that everything is brimming with color and vixity at all times. What else helps Nokia 7.2 stand out? Its battery life is great, the NFC chip enables contactless payments with Google Pay, USB-C used for charging, and you can generously expand 128GB of base storage to an additional 400GB if you plan on storing a bunch of local files. There are not many negatives to Nokia 7.2, but we will point out that the rear cameras of the trilogy are simply nice and bezel down below the screen on the big side of things, it's hard to do much better than the Nokia 7.2. If you prefer to keep your budget even lower, our top recommendation goes to Nokia 4.2. The Nokia 4.2 package is worth seriously. It has a 5.7-inch screen with a small water gap, face unlocking, and metal + glass design that looks and feels as good as phones that cost hundreds of dollars more. Speaking of its design, Nokia 4.2 has some unexpected talent that we dig. There is a button dedicated to causing google assistant, along with LED notification light that wraps around the power button. How neat is it? Specs-wise, the Nokia 4.2 also packs a snapdragon chipset capable of 439. 32GB expandable storage (up to 400GB), fingerprint sensors, and NFC for Google Pay. The screen is not sharpest at only 720p HD and the older Micro USB charging port is irritating, but for the price, it's hard to complain too. The Nokia 5.3 is powered by the familiar Snapdragon 665 chipset and comes with 4GB of RAM and 64GB of internal storage, making it a decent enough phone for day-to-day use. The phone is ready for Android 11, meaning it will be one of the first to get a stable update. There is also a 13MP camera on the back and a 5MP wide angle lens, as well as a 2MP macro and 2MP portrait lens. However, the stand-up feature in Nokia is 5.3 battery life. With a 4000mAh battery under the hood and an energy-efficient chipset, you'll get two days of battery life. The phone has a massive 6.55-inch screen, but the resolution itself is at 720p. That's not so bad as the screen feels good in daily use, but the 1080p panel was better. Elsewhere, there's NFC for Google Pay, FM Radio, 3.5mm headphone jack, Ac Wi-Fi connection and Bluetooth 4.2. Source: Android Central is definitely a unique option since it has an action camera integrated into your chassis. That makes it stand out from the rest of the options available on this list, and if you make a lot of videos go on, it might be a good choice. The camera on the back has a 117-degree wide-angle lens and shoots the horizontal video seamlessly, and Motorola changes the lens position so it can do so. Elsewhere, the phone comes with a 6.3-inch FHD+ screen, fed by Samsung's Exynos 9609 chipset. It's not the fastest phone in this section, but it's now discounted, and it's keeping up well in day-to-day use. You also get 4GB of RAM and 128GB of storage, microSD slots, NFC, FM radio, and even 3.5mm jacks. The 3500mAh battery delivers a day's worth of use with ease, but the downside here is that the charge is limited to 10W. Overall, there's a lot to be loved with an action, and the video camera behind the diffuser is great.
